

Kit Elliott County Counsel, Nevada County

Since 2019, Katharine Elliott is the Nevada County Counsel providing professional legal services and advice to the Board of Supervisors, the County Executive Office, and other County departments. There are 6 attorneys in the office.

Prior to that she served as Mendocino County Counsel (since 2015). Additionally, she has over 27 years of legal experience; serving as Deputy County Counsel in Tulare County for 10 years, Assistant Public Defender in Mendocino County for 4 years and a solo law practice for 13 years in which she handled both criminal and civil cases.



Jackie T. Guevarra, Executive Director Quality and Productivity Commission Executive Office, Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors

Jackie began her County career in 1997. She joined the Department of Auditor-Controller's Audit Division as an Accountant-Auditor. By 2000, she was planning and leading audits of County departments and programs as a Principal

Accountant-Auditor. Her primary clients were the Department on Health Services and Treasurer and Tax Collector. Jackie also served as part of the Special Projects Division (Red Team) and worked on various projects with the Chief Executive Office. After almost fourteen years with the Audit Division, she joined the Accounting Division and supervised the Financial Analysis/Property Tax, Special Funds/Warrants, and Budget/Publication Sections. She was also primarily responsible for coordinating the compilation of the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR)—the County's audited financial statements—coordinated the countywide Fiscal Forum training, and lead the Accounting Division's Mentor/Mentee program.



In 2018, she joined the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors as the Executive Director of the Quality and Productivity Commission (QPC). The Commission was formed to promote innovation, quality, efficiency, and effectiveness of County services. She manages the day-to-day operations of the Commission, works with seventeen Commissioners on various programs/events (e.g., Leadership Conference, Productivity and Quality Awards, Department Visits), and manages the Productivity Investment Fund.

Since 2020, Jackie has served as the Chair of the LACMC Education Committee, which plans and coordinates the monthly training seminars. Jackie has a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a concentration in Accounting from California State University, Northridge. Go Matadors! Jackie is also a Certified Public Accountant.



Kellie Johnson, Assistant Executive Officer Ethics and Compliance Executive Office, Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors

Kellie F. Johnson, Esq. is a distinguished executive leader currently serving as Assistant Executive Officer in Ethics and Compliance with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Executive Office. Kellie plays a major role in planning, organizing, and directing the compliance activities of the EO across legislative review, investigations, audits, and administrative enforcement.

Until May 2024, Kellie was Deputy Chief Ethics Officer for the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority, managing compliance with laws and regulations. She previously served as Enforcement Chief and Executive Director of the City of Oakland Ethics Commission, where she conducted and participated over 75 investigations and developed the Public Ethics Commission Diversion Program.

Earlier in her career, Kellie was Assistant Disciplinary Counsel for the Oregon State Bar and served as a State Prosecutor for over 13 years. Her litigation expertise has significantly shaped her approach to policy development and enforcement of public ethics.

I received my master's and doctorate degrees in clinical psychology from the University of Missouri – St. Louis and I have been a licensed psychologist since 2005.

I began my work with LA County in the Department of Mental Health in 2012. While I was with DMH I worked at Central

Juvenile Hall where I supervised two intensive mental health treatment programs and served as the Acting Program Manager. In 2017 I joined the Department of Human Resources where I perform psychological pre-employment evaluations and fitness for duty evaluations, provide employee assistance counseling, and develop and provide training on various mental health and wellbeing-related topics. I have also maintained a private practice since 2006.

Kristin Sakoda, Director Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture

Kristin Sakoda is Director of the Los Angeles County Department of Arts and Culture, a local arts agency which fulfills a mission to ajdvance arts, culture, and creativity throughout the largest county in the U.S. The Department of Arts and Culture provides grants and technical assistance to hundreds of nonprofit organizations; runs the largest arts

internship program in the nation; coordinates countywide <u>public-private arts education initiatives</u>; increases access to creative career pathways; commissions civic artwork; supports free community programs; leads the LA County Cultural Equity and Inclusion Initiative; and advances cross-sector cultural strategies to address civic issues. Appointed by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Ms. Sakoda previously served as Executive Director of the Los Angeles County Arts Commission. Under her leadership, she led the organization during its historic transition into the County's first Department of Arts and Culture.

Ms. Sakoda is an arts executive, attorney, and performing artist with more than 25 years in the field. She has appeared on national and international stages including with dance and social justice company Urban Bush Women and in musicals *Rent* and *Mamma Mia!* on Broadway. Prior to her work at the Department of Arts and Culture, she served in key leadership roles at the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs overseeing a portfolio of strategic, programmatic, policy, legislative, and funding programs with a \$200 million annual budget, and was instrumental in advancing diversity and inclusion; public art; creative aging; cultural facilities; and affordable workspace for artists. She holds a J.D. from NYU School of Law with honors in Entertainment Law, and B.A. from Stanford University with a specialization in Race and Ethnicity and a secondary major in Feminist Studies. As of 2021, she is a Board member of Grantmakers in the Arts, the national association of public and private arts funders in the U.S.
